## Drink (Pure Water) to your Heart's Content

February is **HEART** month. In addition to being the time to send your sweetie a valentine, it is a time to recognize the important role the heart plays in one's health. Since heart disease is considered one of the top causes for premature death, it is important to do all that one can to prevent it. If one already has some form of heart disease, you should avoid any undue burdens on the heart.

There is very little doubt that our diet and exercise, or lacks thereof, are contributing factors to our heart

health. We are not here to discuss these factors in depth. We will leave that to nutritional doctors. What we would like to delve into, in more detail is the possible role the water we drink plays in matters of the heart. While the amount of water we drink certainly has a bearing on our overall health, the quality of the water we drink is equally important, if not more so!

Some would want you to believe that drinking distilled water will endanger one's heart, leading to a premature death! This is absolute nonsense in my opinion and the eyes of many medical doctors. Many of them prescribe the drinking of distilled water to their patients... especially if they have heart or kidney disease. One of the most famous doctors who tout's the benefits of drinking distilled water is one of the founders of Mayo Clinic. He is quoted below:

"Water Hardness" is the underlying cause of many of the diseases resulting from poisons in the intestinal tract. These (hard minerals) pass from the intestinal walls and get into the lymphatic system, which delivers all of its products to the blood, which in turn, distributes to all parts of the body. This is the cause of much human disease.

"Water Hardness" is inorganic minerals in solution (in water). When these minerals enter the intestines in drinking water, there is an immediate reaction between them and the fats, oils and fatty acids present, causing precipitation of inorganic calcium, magnesium, iron and so on---to form new, insoluble compounds." -[Dr. Charles Mayo \(Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minnesota\)](#)

There is good reason to believe that hardness minerals (trash minerals as I like to refer to them) when combined with the triglycerides (fatty substances found in the blood) and cholesterol, form the various plaques found in the arteries of those with heart disease. The minerals act as the cement or glue to hold the plaques together. (Hardening of the arteries).

There are two similar sounding medical terms which are easily confused, both in spelling and in meaning. They are arteriosclerosis and atherosclerosis. Arteriosclerosis is a general term, describing any loss of elasticity (hardening) in the medium or larger arteries. This occurs mainly because of a plaque like buildup between the inside and outside walls of the

artery. Because veins are single layered blood vessels, we do not hear of hardening of the veins. It apparently does not occur. (Thank goodness.) Atherosclerosis is the hardening of the artery specifically due to the atheromatous plaque in the lumen (opening) of the artery. I firmly believe that hardness minerals are atherogenic substances. (Cause atherosclerosis).

I cannot make health claims, but it is my long held belief and that of my own cardiologist, that if the glues (unassimilated minerals) were not there, the plaques *would not form in the first place!* *This is just one of the many reasons that I not only drink and cook with distilled water, but strongly promote it for use by anyone with heart disease or wanting to possibly avoid it. Naturally one reaps many other health benefits by drinking pure, distilled water. Happy Hearts Day to all.*
